# Water Fair at Berkeley County Youth Fair a great success



# **Enhancing Widmyer Wetlands**

In 2009, the Eastern Panhandle Conservation District restored the wetland area that had been destroyed in in 1975 when Widmyer Elementary School (just south of Berkeley Springs in Morgan County) was constructed. A stone path bisecting the area gave students from the nearby elementary and high school access to the wetlands. Members of the Warm Springs Watershed Association have kept the path weed free, often with the help of students from the high school.
